## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As mentioned in my previous letter my tenure as your President ends August 31. It has been a pleasure to serve. Thank you. The next President will be elected by the Board of Directors at our meeting in Hunt Valley. I wish whoever is chosen the best, and will continue to work on your behalf in whatever capacity I am asked. I do expect to continue as District 6 webmaster.

So where do we go from here? Our population is aging. While I do not have numbers for the entire district, my unit (the Washington Bridge League) began 2004 with 1,703 members averaging 64.08 years of age. As of June 1, 2015 we had 1,707 members averaging 69.33 years, an increase of over 5 years. I expect the numbers are similar for the District as a whole. The handwriting is on the wall. We need to recruit new and younger players or our game will just fade away. While the primary focus of generating interest in the game falls with the ACBL, we in District 6 can do our part in supporting their efforts. Especially, we can make the experience of playing in our games at all levels friendly and welcoming.

To that end we need to concentrate on the quality of the product we deliver. I respectfully request that all persons interacting with the players, directors and volunteers
alike strive to make all interactions memorable in a good way, especially for new
players. Behind the scenes we will be working to ensure materials (playing
cards, bidding boxes, convention cards, etc.) are available in sufficient supply and are clean and presentable. We will be upgrading our signage so
that all can find their way.

Some changes to note: *TableTALK* will be published four times a year rather than six, with a goal of going online in the not too distant future. It is available online now on the D6 website. We have started selling entry vouchers at regionals that can be purchased with a credit card. This reduces the need to handle cash, and one can realize whatever rewards the card offers.

I wish all a good time and an exciting future.

North leads the  $\clubsuit 5$  to the  $\clubsuit 7$ ,  $\clubsuit 8$  and  $\spadesuit 10$ . How should South plan the defense?

Answer: It seems evident that West was hoping for a reopening double to convert for penalty. Declarer has at most four diamond tricks, and two probable spade tricks. It is likely that he needs some club tricks to fulfill his contract. Declarer will win the spade lead and lead a club to the King. You must be prepared to duck smoothly. If you are not smooth, declarer will figure out that you have the Ace and will finesse the \$10 the second time around. If you win the Ace on the first lead, you can set up the spade suit for partner, but she will not have an entry to cash them. By far, your best chance of success is to duck the first club.

## Defense Against Notrump



I asked my expert panel\*—

There are many defenses to an opponent's 1NT opener: Astro, Brozel, Cappelletti, DONT, Landy, Meckwell, Multi-Landy, Natural, Ripstra, Suction, Transfers.

Which defense do you use and what are the advantages of that system?

If you play conventional doubles, at what range do you switch to penalty doubles?

Which defense would you recommend for 1,000-masterpoint players, which is easiest to play and remember?

One expert uses Landy. 2\* shows both majors and all other bids are natural. It's very important to show both majors. You'd like to be 5-5 to show both majors but 5-4 is acceptable, and I've even seen it done with 4-4. Over 2\*, Advancer can bid 2\* asking for Overcaller's longer major, which he'd do if he were 3-3 or 2-2 in the majors.

One expert uses Cappelletti which is also called Hamilton in the west. 24 shows any onesuiter. 2♦ shows both majors. Two-of-a-major shows that major and a minor. Double is penalty. Over two-of-a-major, 2NT asks Overcaller to bid his minor. The only problem is that it's hard to show a four-card major with a longer minor.

Karen Allison—I think all of those you mention are useful. Of course it matters what hand comes up! And of course with most, you give up at least some natural bids which on a given hand can be costly. I generally use Cappelletti that allows me to get one-suiters. majors and two-suiters with a major into the auction. I always want penalty doubles in the mix. That's why I use Cappelletti, which includes them. I feel it is important to have an agreement about when penalty doubles are employed: All balanced hands pass the penalty double. The opponents are not allowed to play two-of-a-minor undoubled, so I can pass a two-of-a-minor runout to see what partner wants to do. Pulling the penalty double shows a weak hand with distribution. I'd recommend Cappelletti. I add the agreement that double by a passed hand shows a one-suiter with clubs.

Some experts use Multi-Landy which is called Woolsey in the West and Robinson in DC. 2♣ shows both majors. 2♦ shows one major. Two-of-a-major shows that major and a minor. Double shows a four-card major and a longer minor. Over 2♦ showing one major, I play that 2♥ is pass or correct to partner's major, usually with a weak hand. All other bids are encouraging. Over weak notrumps you could play penalty doubles instead of the 4-5 bid. The big advantage is that you know the relative lengths of your two suits.

Jill Meyers-Multi-Landy and the advantage is you can show a lot of hands without a lot of guessing.

Adam Wildavsky—I play and enjoy Multi-Landy. It lets me get into the auction on many hands, and I seldom go for numbers. Once in the Cavendish Peter Weichsel went down in a slam against us because he didn't guess which major the 2♦ bidder had. I switch to penalty doubles when their NT range does not contain 16 High Card Points (HCP). I would recommend Multi-Landy. Here in the United States Team Trials an unusually large number of our opponents were playing Landy and transfers.

**Billy Pollack**—I much prefer Multi-Landy and 2NT shows both minors. Three-of-a-minor is natural and denies a four-card major that you want to show. Three-of-a-major is preemptive showing seven tricks if vulnerable.

Barry Rigal—Multi-Landy or Meckwell for choice. I recommend Landy for non-experts. The defenses I prefer let you in on as many twosuiters while distinguishing major/minor lengths. I play penalty doubles of all NT ranges that include 13 HCP and against all players using a strong 1\* system who open 1NT with fewer than 16 HCP in third seat non-vulnerable.

Jon Wittes—Ross Grabel and I use a modified Brozel against strong notrumps, and Cappelletti or Hamilton against weak notrumps. Against strong notrumps, double is a one suiter or both minors if followed by 2NT. 2♣ shows clubs and hearts, 2♦ shows diamonds and hearts, 2♥ shows both majors, 2♠ shows spades and a minor. 2NT shows an unspecified one-suited preempt. Three-level bids are what we call Super Brozel, hands that need very little from partner to make game. Although we use Hamilton against weak notrumps, we still use the three-level bids as Super Brozel. We feel this system allows us to show just about any type of hand over 1NT. We play penalty doubles over any notrump range that tops off at 15 HCP or less.

We love our system, but for players of moderate experience, I think Cappelletti offers a lot of pluses without being too complex to play or remember.

If you're playing penalty doubles only at certain ranges, it's better to agree on a lower number. Saying tops off at 15 HCP means that you would not play penalty doubles if the opponent's NT range was 10-16.

**Chris Compton**—It's a huge edge if your opponents are known never to psyche. Changes double dramatically.

Players who open 14 with 16 or more HCP have been known to open very light notrumps in third seat non-vulnerable.

Marinesa Letizia—I play modified Cappelletti against strong notrumps and transfers against weak. Penalty doubles unless they can have 15 HCP for their 1NT opener. Landy is easiest to remember.

**Marty Bergen**—I play DONT (Disturb the Opponents' Notrump). It's easy to remember, and the best way to overcall aggressively while remaining at the two-level. A double of a 1NT opener with a range of 12-14 HCP is penalty.

Playing DONT, double shows a one-suiter. 2♣ shows clubs and a higher suit. 2♠ shows diamonds and a higher suit. 2♥ shows both majors and 2♠ is natural. The disadvantage is that you don't know the lengths of the two suits. You could be 5-4 either way.

If you're into complicated methods, read the following five conventions. Otherwise go to my recap at the bottom.

Henry Bethe—I play either Natural, Landy, "Asptro", or DONT. I make no claim that these are best, but they are all relatively easy to remember. Asptro is like Astro, e.g. 2♣ is hearts and another, 2♠ is spades and another. But the bidder canapé's the majors: e.g. with longer spades than hearts, start with 2♣, and over 2♠ bid 2♠. With equal or longer hearts, start with 2♠.

Playing regular Astro, responder bids 2♦ without hearts over 2♣ showing hearts and a minor. Responder bids 2♥ without spades over 2♦ showing spades and another suit.

Eddie Kantar—I play 2♣ = majors. 2♦ and 2♥ are transfers. 2♠ shows four spades plus a longer minor. 2NT shows four hearts plus a longer minor. Double is penalty. At least we always find a major suit fit if we have one. A penalty double is usually the strength of a strong notrump or a little less with a good suit to lead. The one I play is sort of easy to remember.

**David Berkowitz—**We play  $2 \clubsuit$  showing both majors and  $2 \spadesuit$  and  $2 \blacktriangledown$  are transfers.

This puts the strong hand on lead. In this day of lighter and lighter notrumps it is nice to have a penalty double. We do play Meckwell in balancing with the Platnick adjunct. When it goes double showing one minor or both majors, 2◆ response says if you have Majors bid your better one. We use penalty doubles if their NT range contains 13 HCP and also over all third seat non-vulnerable NT openers, no matter what they say their range is. I would recommend DONT for 1000-masterpoint players (Larry Cohen made me say this).

John Carruthers—Currently, Joey Silver and I use the Deas/Palmer method, although the version we use may be the original from the 1980's! Double shows any one-suiter or both majors. Two-of-a-minor shows four or more of the minor bid and either five-card major. Two-of-a-major shows exactly four of the major bid and a five-card or longer minor. 2NT shows both minors.

After double, the usual response is  $2 \clubsuit$  and overcaller clarifies by bidding  $2 \spadesuit$  with both majors, so with a one-suiter in diamonds, he needs to bid  $3 \spadesuit$ , either immediately over 1NT or over  $2 \clubsuit$  after Double. The slower method shows a better hand the way we play.

After two-of-a-minor or two-of-a-major, pass or correct applies. Only a suit partner can have is pass or correct. A different suit shows that suit. In all cases where it is available, 2NT is a cuebid, quite strong, since we are aggressive in entering the auction with shape. We employ this method over weak notrumps as well, but not over Mini notrumps.

#### The advantages:

- Any two-suiter can be shown Relative lengths of the two suits are known (no 5/4 either way) to my mind, a huge advantage.
- It is easy to remember, which is becoming more important all the time.
  - 4-4 major fits are found immediately.

It seems that this would be easy enough to penalize, especially two-of-a-major, but in practice, this never happens. The opponents are too concerned with their own potential fit and what they can make, especially if they have a major.

#### Disadvantages:

With no major suit fit after two-of-a-major, you are at the three-level unless advancer has spades over 2♥. There is no penalty double over 1NT, although I have found this double to be truly overrated, since someone always removes if 1NT is going down. With a one-suiter, the opponents have lots of room over Double, whereas they would not over a direct two-of-a-major or three-of-a-minor.

P.S.: My all-time favorite method (promulgated by Morris Timanoff, a relatively unknown Toronto bridge player, in the early 1970s) is Double shows a one-suiter, and any bid is canape, promising a longer suit (any suit). Timmy, as he was known, was ahead of his time in recommending getting into the auction on any excuse, an idea that was not then generally held to be sound. Now we know he was right.

There is another disadvantage of Double showing both majors or one minor. If responder jumps to 3NT you might miss your 5-5 major-suit fit.

Bart Bramley—I play SCUM, a multi-suited defense co-invented by Mark Feldman in the early '70s. Originally it had a different name. Now we call it SCUM as an acronym for Shape-Color-Majors (the "U" is to make it pronounceable, and because we like the name SCUM). The bids are:

Double = two suits of the same shape

(spades and diamonds, or hearts and clubs)

2 = two suits of the same color

 $2 \blacklozenge = both majors$ 

2 of either Major = one-suited, natural

2NT = both minors

Over the ambiguous bids we play pass-orcorrect on the first round, at ANY level. With some partners I play SCUM over all notrump ranges, giving up on the penalty double. With other partners my divide is 14/15 HCP, meaning that any range that includes 15 HCP is "strong", but if the top is 14 HCP or lower, we treat it as weak and play something different (see below). I prefer SCUM to other ambiguous methods (DONT, Meckwell, Woolsey, Astro) because the "tight coupling" makes the ambiguities easier to resolve. If the auction reveals any one suit that partner either has or cannot have, then both his suits are known. Or if advancer has length in one suit of each parity, he can jack it up with the knowledge of a guaranteed fit. Also, SCUM lets us probe for our fit at the two-level in almost all situations (black two-suiters may not get resolved until we reach 3♣). Another plus is that we can show either major unambiguously, which I consider very important. There are two minuses: We cannot show a one-suited minor at the two-level, not a great loss in my opinion. A bigger minus is the inability to distinguish suit lengths with two-suiters.

#### Our "weak" notrump defense is:

Double = penalty, forcing through  $2 \blacklozenge$  (we are not obligated to double the opponents into game)

2 = both majors

 $2 •/2 \lor$  = transfers, showing five+ of the corresponding major - the transfer (usually) assures overcaller of another chance to bid, useful for showing extra values or a second suit

 $2 \blacktriangle =$ four spades and a longer minor

2NT = four hearts and a longer minor

For less complicated methods I suggest Landy or DONT.

John Mohan—It seems apparent that all currently played systems of defensive bidding over 1NT (strong) are seriously flawed. They fail to differentiate between 4-4 and 5-4 or 4-6 and 6-4 thereby either inhibiting the initial action or occasionally resulting in either absurd or non-ideal fits (4-2 or 4-3 as opposed to 5-2 or 5-3). Further, the ability of the initial bidder to express extra values, infrequent but valuable, is either impossible or imprecise with regard to residual distribution.

Over strong notrump, Double = four- or five-card major and four-card or longer minor.

Over the double, 2♣ by responder denies 4-4 in the minors and shows at least two clubs. Doubler passes 2♣ with a four-card major and at least five clubs. Doubler bids 2♦ with a four-card major and at least five diamonds. Doubler bids two-of-his-major with a five-card major. Three-of-either-minor is a strong one-suited minor hand. Over the double, responder bids 2♦ asking for the major suit and promises at least three in either major. Responder can easily be short in clubs. If Responder bids higher than 2♠, it's natural.

Over 2♣, 2♦ asks Overcaller to bid his longer major.

2♦ over 1NT usually shows at least six hearts and 2♥ usually shows at least six spades. With 5-5 and a very good hand, you transfer and then bid your minor.

There are many defenses against 1NT openers, and most of them have a bid to show both majors, which is very important. DONT, Landy and Cappelletti are the easiest to play. With a six-card or longer minor, usually the best way to show it is to jump directly to three-of-your-minor. Three-of-a-minor is hard to double for penalties and takes away the two-level from the opponents. I'd also recommend that if you play different methods based on the opponents' NT range, you say something like —if the range starts at 13 HCP, it's strong.



There's still time to qualify for the **North American Pairs,** a North American Championship that begins in your club and concludes at the Spring 2016 NABC in Reno, NV. Come out and play in a local club qualifier. You've got to play to win!

**Club qualifying** for the 2015-2016 event continues until the end of August 2015. There are three Flights, Open, 0-2500 and Non-Life Master (with fewer than 500 points). Qualification in a flight qualifies you for all lower flights for which you are eligible. Qualification is by individual (not pair) - including flight eligibility — from any club qualifier in the ACBL directly to the District 6 Final. Flight eligibility is determined by your master point holding on June 1, 2015. All players who play in the District Final must have qualified at the club level and be bona fide members of District 6. There will be no **exceptions.** See the District 6 website (www.districtsix.org) for information on club games in your area.

The District 6 Final for all flights will

be held on the weekend of September 19-20, 2015. The Open Flight and 0-2500 Flight Finals will be 4-session events, with roughly half the field qualifying for the second day. The NLM Flight Final will be a 2-session event held on Sunday, September 20.

The Open event and Northern site for the 0-2500 and NLM will be at the White Oak Community Center, 1700 April Lane, Silver Spring MD. Game time is noon and TBA on Saturday, and 11 and TBA on Sunday.

The 0-2500 and NLM will have a Southern site in Richmond VA, at the Clarion Hotel, 3207 North Boulevard. (Special Bridge Rate: \$59.00! Call 804-359-9441) Game time is 10:30 and TBA both days.

Players may play in the 0-2500 and/or NLM at either site.

Pre-registration is required in order to play in the District Finals. Pairs must pre-register by September 10, 2015. To pre-reg-

ister, send the player names, contact information and player numbers and a check made payable to District 6 in the amount of \$50.00, to cover two (2) sessions of the event. For the NORTH, send it to: District 6, PO Box 3329, Silver Spring MD 20918. Pre-register for the SOUTH by sending it to Barry Fratkin,1935 Hickoryridge Road, Richmond, VA 23238. A list of registered pairs will be posted to the District 6 web site after registration closes.

Qualifiers who play in the National Final will be subsidized (to various extents) for travel expenses and hotel rooms by the ACBL and/or District 6. Membership dues or Life Master service fee must be current and continuous from the start of the 2015-16 District Final to the completion of the North American Pairs Final at the Reno NABC in order to play in the National Final.
