The following experts have the right idea. Make a rule and live with it. There are two possibilities for the meaning of double here. One is penalties and the other is a light takeout double. Since you could have doubled earlier, penalties makes more sense. (Ogust is a convention whereby you bid 2NT over a weak two bid by partner to find out more about partner's suit quality and hand quality. 3* is bad hand/bad suit and 3♠ is good hand/good suit, 3 ♦ is usually good suit/bad hand and 3 ♥ is bad suit/good hand.)



After $1 \checkmark - Pass - 2 \checkmark - Pass - Pass$, double is a balancing double and not a penalty double. After $1 \checkmark - Pass - 1 \checkmark - Pass - 2 \checkmark$ or $1 \checkmark - Pass - 1 \checkmark - Pass - 1 \lor - Pas$

There are experts who think all four doubles are penalty.

Kit Woolsey—All are penalties. General rule is: If had a chance to make a takeout double of the suit previously and passed instead, then the double is penalty. Only exception is when they raise (don't take a preference between two suits) to the two-level – then a double is takeout.

Fred Stewart—All of them are penalties. Our philosophy is to act sooner rather than later ... thus (1) unless they have raised (not taken a preference between two suits) to the two-level, and we could have made a take out double earlier, then all later doubles of that strain are for penalties. (2) All doubles of 4 and higher are penalties.

Jeff Rubens— (1) Penalty, but not so much spades as transferable values, typically three aces or the equivalent. (2) Penalty; above the "level of expected takeout," so might include spade values. (3) Penalty; sort of hand that I did not want to double for takeout. (4) Penalty.

Carlos Pellegrini—All four are penalty doubles.

Marinesa Letizia—All are penalty. I have a simple rule. If I didn't make a takeout double, the first time, why would it be takeout the next time when suit is just repeated?

Chuck Berger—All are penalty.

Frank Stewart—In my opinion, all of these logically doubles are for penalty. Cy the Cynic has a rule about whether a double is for penalty. A double made in tempo is for penalty, a double made after some consideration is not. Cy says this "rule" is favored by certain players, especially if they are less experienced. Cv is just being his usual cynical self, but really — when learning players are exposed to cooperative action and all kinds of "you-figure-it-out" doubles, does that not tend to foster ethical problems?

Frank Stewart's Cy the Cynic rule is a good reason not to play 'You figure it out' doubles since partner's tempo could give you illegal information about his intent. The rest of the experts are guessing about some of the doubles. The problem with 'look at your hand doubles' is that LHO can bid 2NT with a singleton spade or four spades. He can also raise with two or five.

Richie Schwartz—Penalties. Only minors are takeout. Example: 1 ♦ - Pass - 1NT - Pass - 2 ♦ - double or Pass - Pass - double.

Alan Sontag— (2) and (4) are penalty. 2 → Pass - Pass - Double now is a "look at your hand double." Generally if you are in front of the suit, double is takeout, unless you have another agreement like my example.

There are experts who play some of the doubles are takeout.

Ron Smith—(1) Takeout (2) Penalty (3) Takeout (4) Penalty.

Marty Bergen—If I currently played with an expert partner, these would all be defined. As it is, (1) sounds like light takeout. The

other three sound like penalty.

Jill Meyers—(1) Takeout. (2) Takeout with notrump strength but not great in other major. (3) Takeout. (4) Penalty. I play most low-level doubles are takeout.

Drew Casen—(1) Light takeout double with zero or one spade, probably 9-11 points, for sure at least four cards in all suits, or equal level conversion shape. (2) Typically 2=2=5-4 with no spade stopper and lots of defense. (3) Light takeout (4) Penalty. On the first three hands, the opponents voluntarily raised themselves in spades, so there is no penalty double. On the last auction, only one opponent bid spades, so there is no agreed fit by them, therefore penalty.

Danny Gerstman—(1) Takeout - but wrong shape. After all I'm forcing to the fourlevel. I'd guess a 2=4=2=5 pattern. (2) Penalty - the only one of the four I think is clear cut penalty. You're not coming in at the five-level now when you couldn't act earlier. (3) Penalty/cooperative - good hand, wasn't willing to walk into their good hand, but now that partner knows they're going nowhere, he has to protect. Not necessarily a spade-trap but good hand. (4) Takeout - right shape too weak to act the first time.

Billy Pollack— (1) Penalty. Makes no sense to pass at the two-level, and then back in at the three-level. Good trumps, not quite enough for 2NT the first time: ♠ KJ108♥Axx♠Axxx♣J10x. (2) Penalty, same as (1). (3) Takeout Doubles 'in front' much more likely to be takeout in unclear situations. (4) Penalty, as above.

Ronnie Rubin— (2) and (4) are penalties.

Adam Wildavsky—I usually play all these as penalties, but it would be reasonable to play them as two-way. Surely partner will know your intent better than 95% of the time.

Two-way doubles can lead to disasters. For instance in the third auction, does LHO have four spades with a weak invite or does he have one spade and a strong hand? Auction (3) happened to me. I held $\triangle Ax \lor Jxxx \lor Q10xxx \checkmark Jx$ and assumed that partner was making a light takeout double. I pulled partner's penalty double and went for -1700. LHO held $\triangle x \lor AKO10 \lor AKJxx \checkmark Jx$.

Zia Mahmood—I play most of these twoway. Penalty or takeout, but to be penalty, you MUST know partner has no more than one trump. (4) is penalty.

Steve Garner—Not strict rules - most doubles at the two- and three-level are takeout, but sometimes partner can work out they are NOT penalty. (1) This would be a "look at your hand" double. (2) Penalty in my book. (3) Takeout. (4)

STRATIFICATION of events is based on average masterpoints of the team or pair. In any event or flight with an upper limit, no individual's total Masterpoint holding may exceed that upper limit.

DIRECTIONS: From Route 50/Arlington Boulevard heading west from DC and Arlington AND from Route 495/Beltway: Continue on/Take Route 50 West about one mile outside the Beltway, and turn left at Javier Road (the second stoplight after the intersection of 50 and 495). Take an immediate right onto the access road that runs parallel to Route 50. The Elks Lodge will be two buildings down on your left—parking on the side and in the rear. From Fairfax, heading East on Route 50: Pass the intersection of Route 50 and Prosperity Avenue—the Prosperity Medical Center will be on your right. Between the first and second lights after Prosperity, turn right into the access road that runs parallel to Route 50 and look for the Elks Lodge immediately to your right—parking on the far side of the building and in the rear.

Very likely penalty - but again, I would need confirmation by looking at my hand.

The problem with (4) being 'look at your hand double' is: suppose you hold ♠xx♥AKxx ♠Q10xxx♣Jx. The spade layout could be zero by responder and six by opener or three by responder and seven by opener.

Joel Wooldridge— (1) Two-way is optimal. If not, then takeout. (2) Penalty (3) Penalty (4) Penalty.

Barry Rigal— (1) Two way strong penalty or weak takeout. (2) Ditto. More likely penalty though. (3) Penalty (4) Penalty.

Eddie Kantar— (1). Either – or. I have found that in some sequences at times one would want to make a penalty double and at other times a takeout double. This is one of them. If partner looks at his spades he should be able to tell. (2) Penalty. It seems inconceivable that this could be for takeout after having passed 2. (3) Penalty. If a double of 2NT is played as a takeout double of spades, then this double should be for penalty. Without this agreement, I would play it as either-or. (4) Penalty. Suit has not been supported. Doubler is behind the bidder, responder normally short in spades. However, I'd be more comfortable with this double if the 1NT response was not forcing. If it was forcing and responder could have spades, then I can live with either-or. In truth. I would only play this way with a regular partner of expert quality. Since I haven't played seriously for many years, I have no idea if this either-or method is playable or simply disaster invitational, which I fear.

Dave Berkowitz—Our simple rule is that if it is not defined in our notes as penalties, it is takeout. (1) and (3) two-way. Either light

takeout or penalty.

(2) and (4) Penalty.

Only two experts don't play (4) as penalties.

Steve Bloom—(2) Penalties. The rest are takeout. Might not be best, but our rules are pretty simple - doubles at the one and twolevel are take-out, unless specifically agreed otherwise. Those exceptions are: (1) After a 1NT opening. (2) When we have shown length in the suit bid. (3) After a pre-empt opening by partner. (4) In a strong auction, double of a new suit. (5) Double of a notrump overcall.

So (4) shows some type of flawed take-out double. Doubles at the three-level are not penalty when the suit has been raised. So, (3) is not penalties. Doubles at higher levels are more penalty oriented, so (2) is penalties. The only ambiguous one here is (3), where the suit has been raised only in some indirect manner. Partner said she probably would not make such a double. If it came up, look at your hand and guess!

John Carruthers—I like (1), (2) and (3) as penalty; (4) as some sort of flawed takeout.

The following expert bases his doubles on the opponents' vulnerability since they are usually sounder when vulnerable.

Ralph Katz—Either you can play pass and then double as takeout, penalty, or, what might be best is takeout when the opponents are vulnerable and penalty when they are non-vulnerable. Best against opponents who are quite active when they are non-vulnerable. The last auction, a double of $2 \blacktriangle$ is clearly penalty.

I think all four should be for penalties. However, what's more important is that your partner knows what the double is.

It's time to start thinking about the North American Pairs! The North American Pairs is a North American Championship that begins in your club and concludes at the Spring 2017 NABC in Kansas City, MO. Come out and play in a local club qualifier. You've got to play to win!

Club qualifying for the 2016-2017 event will be held during June, July, and August of 2016. There are three Flights: Open, 0-2500 and Non-Life Master (with fewer than 500 points). Qualification in a flight qualifies you for all lower flights for which you are eligible. Qualification is by individual (not pair) - including flight eligibility — from any club qualifier in the ACBL directly to the District 6 Final. Flight eligibility is determined by your masterpoint holding on June 1, 2016. All players who play in the District Final must have qualified at the club level and be bona fide members in good standing of District 6. There will be no exceptions. See the District 6 website (www.districtsix.org) for information on club games in your area.

The District 6 Final for all flights will be held on the weekend of September 24-25, 2016 at the White Oak Community Center. The Open Flight and 0-2500 Flight Finals will be 4-session events, with roughly half the field qualifying for the second day. The NLM Flight Final will be a 2-session event held on Sunday, September 25.

Pre-registration is required in order to play in the District Finals. Pairs must pre-register by Sept. 15, 2016. Prepayment of \$50 (to cover two sessions) is required with registration. Instructions for preregistration will be published in future issues of

Answer: Your partner may not realize how bad the opening lead was. You know that if declarer can get to their hand, they have at least seven tricks. You must make an unusual play to let partner know that action is called for. At trick two, you must drop the ♣J. This is called an *alarm clock* signal. The unnecessary play of a high honor tells partner that there's the need to make an unusual play. In this instance, you need to alert partner that the club suit is coming in for declarer. The only chance to beat the hand is for partner to win the first heart, and start on spades or diamonds. A lead of either suit will allow East/West to defeat the hand.



DIRECTIONS: From Route 50/Arlington Boulevard heading west from DC and Arlington AND from Route 495/Beltway: Continue on/Take Route 50 West about one mile outside the Beltway, and turn left at Javier Road (the second stoplight after the intersection of 50 and 495). Take an immediate right onto the access road that runs parallel to Route 50. The Elks Lodge will be two buildings down on your left—parking on the side and in the rear. From Fairfax, heading East on Route 50: Pass the intersection of Route 50 and Prosperity Avenue—the Prosperity Medical Center will be on your right. Between the first and second lights after Prosperity, turn right into the access road that runs parallel to Route 50 and look for the Elks Lodge immediately to your right—parking on the far side of the building and in the rear.
